Mike Stevens, MD, MPH, FACP, FIDSA, FSHEA is an Associate Professor of Internal Medicine at Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) where he is also an Associate Hospital Epidemiologist, the director of the medical center's Antimicrobial Stewardship Program and an Associate Program Director for the Internal Medicine Residency Program, where he is also the Global Health & Health Disparities Pathway Director. He is also the director of the medical center's Travel & Tropical Medicine Clinic and Associate Chair for the Division of Infectious Diseases.

He is a graduate of the VCU School of Medicine (MD) and was a resident and a chief resident in Internal Medicine at VCU where he also completed fellowships in Infectious Diseases and Hospital Epidemiology. He completed a Master of Public Health (MPH) degree at VCU and is board certified in Internal Medicine and Infectious Disease by the American Board of Internal Medicine.

Dr. Stevens' areas of interest and research focus on the interplay between Antimicrobial Stewardship and resistance, infection control and the epidemiology of health care-associated infections. Additionally, Dr. Stevens' research focuses on optimizing the delivery of health care in rural, underdeveloped settings (particularly in Central America). Dr. Stevens is interested in optimizing the training of graduate and post-graduate students in global health and health disparities.
